Note. The curves indicate an elevation of 300 feet (estimated). The only exception being those in the Wallah Wallah Valley, showing the small dividing ridge between the numerous little streams, which are only from 15 to 30 feet high. The rolling country represented on this map is covered with the most luxuriant bunch-grass, the valleys of the rivers and creeks tributary to Columbia and Snake rivers contain the farming land. Approximate location of Military road constructed 1850 to 1862.
